

Cultural Visionary, David Brewster, to speak at Spring Luncheon -

David Brewster, Executive Director of Town Hall Seattle, will speak at the Association's Spring Luncheon on April 28, to be held at the College Club of Seattle. During his talk, "Rebooting Seattle: Where is the Region Heading?" Brewster will discuss surprising new regional data and its implications for the Pacific Northwest. He also will describe the leading contenders for strategic directions, comment on trends in education, and give his vision for a "right-sized" city.

Mr. Brewster, an engaged Seattle observer for nearly four decades and founder of the award-winning *Seattle Weekly*, has earned a reputation as "one of this city's best informed and most readable writers." He is recognized as one of 150 Seattleites most influential in the city's history, according to a 2001 *Seattle Times* panel.

The 1999 opening of Town Hall Seattle (for Web site click [here](#)), under Brewster's steady hand, realized his dream of creating a "community cultural center with roots in the ethnic communities." Already Town Hall hosts 350 events per year with most recent budget growth at 35 percent. Brewster rallied a group of 15 additional investors, and led the purchase and renovation effort. The nonprofit institution is located at 8th & Seneca on First Hill in a vintage 1922 church.

Brewster, a Phi Bete from Yale University, hails from New Jersey. A University of Washington teaching position landed him in Seattle in 1965. We are honored to welcome Mr. Brewster. [Click here](#) to see a photo of Mr. Brewster.

NORTH ON I-5: Madison St. (& I-90) Exit. (164A). Left on Madison to 5th Ave. Left on 5th Ave. Thirty feet ahead, on the left, is the entrance to the College Club garage.
