

#### **Board Member Spotlight: Melisa Lasell**

Melisa was born in Northern California and lived for 20 years in Italy where she owned and operated a PR agency that conducted media relations in five languages for small and multinational clients. Her team designed and produced branding events that attracted visitors world-wide and, over time, she began to specialize in architecture, industrial design, personal protection and 3D printing with clients that included DuPont, Disney, DSM, Missoni, Zaha Hadid, Jean Nouvelle, and Karim Rashid, to name only a few. After returning to the USA, she was ready for a career change, and graduated from UC Berkeley in 2018 with a B.A. in Sociology; her induction into Phi Beta Kappa came later in 2019 and she earned a Masters of Public Policy from Mills College in Spring 2022. She moved to Seattle in Fall 2022 when she started a service year with AmeriCorps, working as a volunteer Digital Equity Coordinator at Seattle Housing Authority. There she works to build SHA capacity to support its residents' digital skills and equity needs. She has already secured a federal grant that will fund 11 new positions, revamped the agency's recording and reporting tools, and is currently drafting a 5 year plan for the SHA Digital Equity team. She loves Seattle and plans to remain here with her 19 year old Italian cat Strillo.

#### FINANCE CHALLENGE: Howard Johnson, Treasurer

Due to a decline in general economic conditions of these past couple years, PSA-PBK has experienced a significant loss of funding in its scholarship fund. This asset level for scholarship funding is something the Board is addressing now with a very special "asset restoration" plan. A key part of this "asset restoration" plan is our solicitation of significant financial support in these final months of the 2022-23 fiscal year from a few of our more substantial givers of the recent past. This special restoration effort should help us reach at least the 95% level (as required by Board policy) by the beginning of the 2023-24 year. The exact amount of funding required to reach this 95% level is not known for certain; however, the Finance committee is estimating it will be in the \$18,000 to \$20,000 range.

We are indeed thankful that some of our loyal members are forthcoming with this needed level of support at this special time in our organization's history and are anticipating that a combination of a reduction in the level of scholarships awarded and the implementation of our normal annual development efforts over these next 2-3 years should raise our scholarship fund back to a level that can sustain our annual scholarship awards in the \$14,000 to \$16,000 range. This will be the task facing our Finance committee and Board as we prepare the budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year.
