Each year the Puget Sound Association of Phi Beta kappa honors individuals, organizations, or institutions with our Pathfinder Award. The award reflects the imagery on the Phi Beta Kappa key — a hand pointing to the stars. It honors those who encourage others to seek new worlds to discover, pathways to explore, and untouched destinations to reach. This year we will be presenting three Pathfinder Awards.

- Atlantic Street Center, a non-profit social service agency which works to help families and communities raise healthy and successful children and youth through direct services as well as advocacy for social justice and equity. This includes services such as education, family support, and behavioral health counseling to low-income minority populations in King and Pierce Counties.
- Andrea Liao, founder of Book the Future. Andrea is an Interlake High School student who founded "Book the Future," which has as its goal providing diverse books to children to help improve their futures and obtain global youth literacy. This includes monthly book drives, summer literacy camps, writing workshops, and a digital magazine.
- Luis Ortega, founder of Storytellers for Change, an organization committed to building an empathetic, inclusive, and equitable world by harnessing the power of stories to make social change.

Phi Beta Kappa Visiting Scholar Karen Fleming: "Nurturing a More Inclusive Sciences, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Pipeline"

Public Lecture Monday May 17, 4:00 p.m.

The University of Washington Alpha Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa is co-hosting a Phi Beta Kappa Visiting Scholar, Professor Karen Fleming, in May for several virtual events. The Chemistry Department, the Allen School of Computer Science & Engineering, and the Advance Center for Institutional Change are also co-hosts. Professor Fleming is Professor of Biophysics at Johns Hopkins University. Her public lecture on Monday, May 17, at 4 p.m. is titled "Nurturing a More Inclusive Sciences, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Pipeline."

PSA-PBK Scholarships

PSA-PBK offers six scholarships to students at University of Washington and University of Puget Sound. Application materials and general information can be found at <u>www.psa-pbk.org/scholarships</u>. The Undergraduate Scholarship due date is May 17 for UW, April 26 for UPS; applicants do not need to be PBK members. A GPA of at least 3.8 is required, as well as an essay on the one book the applicant would recommend to other college students. Four winners will each receive \$2,000.

The Lupton First-Generation Scholarship honors the life and achievements of Myra Lupton. Ms. Lupton served on the PSA-PBK board for more than 40 years, fulfilling many roles in the organization. She taught English at Sammamish High School and had a deep affinity for children and youth. Her estate funded the annual scholarship for an undergraduate student who is the first in their family to attend college. This year, the award will be \$3,400. The due date is June 7.

The Stiefel Graduate Award of \$4,500 is given to a student who is beginning a graduate or professional program at UW or UPS. Ernie Stiefel was a long-time PSA-PBK board member and treasurer who ably guided the association's finances for many years. Applicants must be members of PBK invited by the UPS or UW chapters. The Stiefel Award due date is June 30.
